School Council—Desk Top Calendar Fundraiser



Message from Shropshire Council: Urgent COVID-19 Update – Join the Booster Army.

We've been rapidly working behind the scenes to ensure we are geared-up and ready for the ambitious programme to deliver the COVID19 boosters across Shropshire.

This inevitably is a huge task and requires significant effort to ensure we are doing everything we can to keep Shropshire's population healthy and reduce the risk of further spread.

We are organising extended opening arrangements at the walk-in vaccination facility at the Shropshire Local unit in the Darwin Centre in Shrewsbury, including evening and Saturday opening from Wednesday 15 December. We'll also be supporting increased opening at other locations and more mobile vaccination units across the county very soon.

Can you help mobilise the Booster Army? Marshals needed.

We are asking for volunteers and for people to consider whether they can help. Initially, we are calling out for help to marshal the walk-in vaccination centre in Shrewsbury, including weekends. More roles and help at more locations will be announced shortly.
