Covid Update

There is a temporary pause of confirmatory PCR tests: a follow-up PCR test after a positive LFD test is NOT necessary and should only be done if you: wish to claim the Test and Trace Support Payment; have been advised to take a PCR test because of being in a clinically vulnerable group; have been advised to do so as part of a research or surveillance programme.

#### KEY THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- Please use LFDs to screen for the virus before attendance on Monday
- If you have a positive LFD result you should isolate. From Monday 17 January, people who are selfisolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day.
- All children have been given a 'home learning' book to be kept at home. This can then be used for work in the event of having to isolate (but well enough to keep up with school work) or the school having to set up home learning for a class if all other alternatives have been exhausted.
